## **Target audience**

The amount of participants was coherent with forecasts: 39, plus 18 people from different Swiss institutions and companies supporting during the visits.

In terms of countries the target was met: the participants were mainly from Italy (28), but most countries of the region were represented: Slovenia (4); France (2), Spain (3), Switzerland (2).

In terms of categories, participants were quite evenly spread: regional and local authorities, consultants and few researchers. In overall terms, the target categories were satisfactorily reached.

## Objectives

The main objectives - providing opportunities to discuss and share knowledge on previous restoration experiences in terms of management alternatives, technical approaches, monitored benefits in relation to urbanised contexts, based upon real cases of particular interest and highlight synergies between river restoration and nature conservation (i.e.: WFD vs. HD implementation) - were fully met.

## **Outcomes**:

Coherently with expectations, the main outcomes of the field trip were the following:

- increased knowledge by project participants on feasible RR alternatives, especially in urbanised or highly constrained contexts, and of successful policy and legislative alternatives implemented in Switzerland;
- increased interaction and awareness of possible synergies between sectors of the public administration not always successfully communicating among them: basin planning and management, urban development, nature conservation;
- increased knowledge of RR as a tool to fulfil not only WFD, but also HD goals;
- a dossier on visit sites/projects.

## Feedback to the overall RESTORE project


- Information and documentation on RR projects useful to feed the database + dossier downloadable from the website.

be useful to feed the thematic sections of the website and for further events organised by other partners.






#### 2 Quality of logistical aspects during the field trip
