REFORM stakeholder workshop

<u>REFORM</u> (REstoring rivers FOR effective catchment Management) is an integrated research project that aims to improve existing river restoration tools and develop new ones to increase the success and cost-effectiveness of restoration measures. REFORM recently hosted a stakeholder workshop in Brussels.

The first results of REFORM were presented, along with feedback and consultation between scientists and technical experts.

Peter Kristensen from the European Environment Agency told us that countries generally have a good understanding of the pressures impacting their rivers and estuaries. However we need more work to improve our rivers as more than half of them are in less than 'good status' as defined by the Water Framework Directive. He highlighted that physical changes have lead to altered habitats and degraded ecosystems.

Submissions for the <u>5th European River Restoration Conference</u>, being organised by RESTORE and the European River Restoration Centre, are being accepted until 15th April.

There are still a few weeks left to submit your submissions for conference presentations and posters. We are receiving strong interest, but also want to encourage more. If you are considering a submission, here are a few tips and tricks:

- We encourage submissions (such as case studies and presentations that cover topics from policy to monitoring) that link to our eleven conference themes, and inspire 'how to do'.
- Don't view strict adherence to the themes as a barrier to making a submission.
- Be imaginative instead of PowerPoint why not a <u>short film</u> or maybe try a Vox Pop (short interviews) to incorporate views from outside the conference.
- Sessions will have different formats, so propose submissions that include discussion or interaction with the audience.
- We are also happy to receive more traditional presentations.
- In your submission please include a title and short description of the topic and format of the presentation (250 words approximately).
- When drafting a submission, consider the key challenges; your main messages; the aspects of your submission you would like to discuss.
- If selected you will need to provide a draft version of the presentation prior to the event. You might also be invited to be the keynote speaker of your session.
- We also welcome poster submission summaries. Posters selected for the conference will need to be printed (maximum 95 x 205 cm). There is a prize for the best posters at the conference!
