

Imaginative design, improved habitats and better space for recreation are essential elements of revitalised and restored London rivers. These were the key messages of RESTORE's network event held at New London Architecture this month, attended by over 200 people.

Antonia Scarr (Environment Agency) outlined the pressures on London's rivers due to population growth, development, and drainage and waste issues. She said that lessons could also be learned from practices abroad, such as in Munich, where measures introduced to sections of the Isar river have resulted in a 'summer playground' for the city.

Principal Engineer Mike Vaughan from Atkins also spoke at the event about his work on the River Lee which has revitalised the area around the Olympic Park.

Workshop: Improving Morphology and fish passage in high energy rivers

A RESTORE workshop focusing on high energy rivers was held on the 25th September in Birnam, Scotland with visits to a number of nearby sites on the 26th including the River Tummel.
