RESTORE at the 8th European Conference on Ecological Restoration


České Budějovice, Czech Republic, September 2012

A workshop presenting the European-wide value of RESTORE and launching the River Wiki was given by Toni Scarr (Environment Agency) and Martin Janes (RRC) at the 8th European Conference on Ecological restoration.

An audience of researchers, policymakers, river basin managers and practitioners were shown the RESTORE website www.restorerivers.eu and the River Wiki <http://riverwiki.restorerivers.eu>; an online knowledge management system of case studies.

Following the presentation a group discussion was held and participants were asked about the types of organisations that could benefit from the information gained at the workshop and how RESTORE could share good practice in Europe. Audience members were also encouraged to upload their best case studies onto the River Wiki and to recommend good case studies.

The National Institute of Hydrology and Water Management (NIHWM) presented a poster at the international conference Water Resources and Wetlands, in Tulcea, Romania in September.

NIHWM's poster was entitled 'River Restoration Knowledge and was presented within the Water Policies section of the conference which addressed
