CHANGE OF THE ECRR SECRETARIAT

At the end of 2006 the Italian Centre for River Restoration (CIRF) took the secretariat of the European Centre for River Restoration (ECRR) and it will coordinate the activities of the Centre until the year 2009. This was possible thanks to a funding granted from the Italian Ministry of the Environment.

CIRF is a non profit technical-scientific association created in 1999 by a group of technicians with different background to promote the culture of river restoration and its related know-how. CIRF aims at:

- increasing the awareness about the benefits of river restoration, through educational activities, publications and dialogue with public authorities, professionals and researchers;
- coordinating, promoting and supporting pilot studies and innovative projects on river restoration and sustainable river management;
- developing and stimulating the involvement of all public and private subjects interested in the management of water and land.

4TH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON RIVER RESTORATION

One of the main tasks of CIRF's secretariat is the organization of the 4th International Conference on River Restoration, that will be held in Venice, Italy, June 16 to 21, 2008. BIG JUMP 2007

The "Big Jump - European River Swimming day - Swimming for better rivers" is an international event carried out by the European River Network that have come in 2007 to its fourth edition (the previous were on 2002, 2005 and 2006).

On the Big Jump day everybody will swim in the rivers on the same day, at the same hour, in all the European rivers, from the sources and the glaciers to the oceans.

With over 250 000 visitors, the Big Jump 2005 was a success. Along 31 rivers in 22 countries, 216 official actions, 240 unofficial spontaneous jumps have been well organized!
